In 1842, there were produced, in the United States, 100,000,000 bushels of wheat, and 140,000,000 bushels of Indian corn; which, at the rate of one dollar per bushel for the former, and twenty-five cents for the latter, were worth one hundred and thirty-five million, five hundred thousand dollars. Fifteen per cent, clear of the interest of the capital invested in lands, implements, hired and personal labour, is a liberal estimate of the profit accruing to the wheat and corn grower. Then the profit of this amount of grain would be twenty million, three hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars. The appropriation to the army and navy, during the same year, was twenty million, one hundred and fifty thousand, five hundred and one dollars. In other words, the army and navy ate up the whole harvest of wheat and corn throughout the Union! Will not the hard-working farmers think on this fact?
