

THE SUMMER SESSION.

Attendance upon ONE Summer Session is now made compulsory by the Medical Council of Ontario, and the teaching throughout this Session is thoroughly practical. The Session of 1894 began on Monday, April 30th, and continued for two months, and that of 1895 will be *essentially similar*.

The instruction given in the summer Session will be clinical and practical rather than didactic, and given, chiefly in the Theatre, the Wards, and the Out-door Departments of the Toronto General Hospital, and of the Hospital for Sick Children, while in the College, courses of lectures will be given on Medical and Surgical Diseases of Children,—Dietetics,—Nervous Diseases, and on other subjects.

The course on Obstetrics will consist of demonstrations on the Mechanism of Labor on the manikin, and the chief operations of Midwifery.

Clinical instruction will be given daily in the Theatre, as well as in the Wards and Out-door Department, thus giving students opportunities for observing every variety of practice Medical and Surgical, remedial measures other than drugs—at the bedside and in the consulting room.

There will be a special series of demonstrations on minor Surgery—Bandaging, Splints and Dressings. In Surgical Anatomy there will be practical work done on the *cadaver*.

In Pathology the course will consist of the display and careful study of gross specimens.

Physical diagnosis will be taught by a series of demonstrations upon the normal subject before the class, and in these, as in all the demonstrations, the aim of the instructors will be to make the student do for himself, the examination and manipulation necessary.

Fee for the course \$30.

Those who have paid for a former Summer course are permitted to attend a second session, without further charge, on presentation of their tickets.

Fees are to be paid not later than May 15th, and will be received at the Faculty Room of the College at 1.30 p.m. on Mondays and Tuesdays during the first three weeks of the Session.
