COLONIAL REVOLUTION

The War Has Given the Dominions a New Status in the Empire, but No Right of Secession.

(Manchester Guardian.) A comparison of the position of Australia or Canada as they were ten years ago with their position today shows that the British Commonwealth has passed through a revolution. The new relationship has long been implicit in the old, though, if there had been no war, it might have developed much more gradually and perhaps relucfantly. The war, with its problems, its experiences, and its consequences, has brought the dominions from the position in which, according to Gen. Smuts, they were still "subject provinces of Great Britain" into the position they occupy today—of "absolute equality and freedom with the other nations of the world." Whatever it has done with democracy elsewhere, the war has in this definite and limited sense made democracy safe in the dominions.

It was the final act of the war, the making of the peace, that really set the seal on the new position of the dominions. In 1897 and 1902 they had declined to take any share in the control of British foreign policy or the burdens of the defence of the empire. The history of these developments, with a full account of their consequences and implications, is to be found tin an admirable volume published by the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace ("War Government of the British Dominions"). The writer, Dr. A. B. Keith, is, of course, a well-known

authority on his subject.

In commercial conventions the right of the dominions to separate representation had been recognized before the war, and after some discussion it was decided that the dominions should send their and after some discussion it was decided that the dominions should send their own representatives to Paris. It is interesting to notice that Canada was specially anxious for this, and that Australia was less eager, though she had protested against the conduct of the British government in assenting to the armistice terms without consulting her. It was agreed finally that Canada, Australia, and South Africa should each have two representatives and New Zealand one. The peace gave the dominions a recognized position as nations. As members of the League of Nations they send delegates to that assembly who are quite independent of British influence; and the assembly, which elects four members of the council, may elect a dominion representative if it desires.

Parliament Not Supreme.

The dominions differ, of course, in their political arrangements. Canada and Australia are true federal constitutions. South Africa, New Zealand and Newfoundland have single parliaments, though in South Africa there are proving the supplements.

Then the powers of the Canadian and Australian parliaments are limited by the rights of local legislatures. What of the rights of the Imperial parliament? Gen. Smuts laid it down in a debate on the Peace Treaty in September, 1919, that "as a result of the new status of the dominions the parliament of the United Kingdom and no right to legislate for the Union, and that the royal veto was obsolete with regard to dominion legislation." 


