

BELIEVED MAN FOUND ON TRACK WAS MURDERED

Thorold, Aug. 16-Early in the morn ng the engineer of a Grand Trunk noticed the body of a man on the tracks, near the Beaver Board Company's plant, just south of Thorold, but was unable to stop the train before the engine and to stop the train before the engine and some cars had passed over the body. The crew at once notified the despatcher at Merritton, and John Flett, county constable. Inside the pocket of the coat was the name O. Romano, March 25, 1918, made by the Premier Tailoring Co, 124 Richmond street west, Toronto, Ont. It is not known whether the man was hit by a train or murdered and placed on the tracks afterwards, as the body was found not far from the spot where a foreigner was beaten unconscious and robbed a few nights ago, and two other foreigners were attacked while asleep on the porch of their house by three men with an axe and knives. The body has been removed to Williams' Undertaking rooms, pending an inquest being held by Dr. Colbeck, of Welland. House and Ffeehold Lot 04775-8-15.
