LIKELY TO HAVE ELECTION BY OCTOBER

Liberals Show Fighting Spirit in Caucus and Decide to Go to Country With Reciprocity—Sanguine of Sweeping Victory

Ottawa, July 25.—The only question now is as to when the government will give up the present struggle to make headway against the obstructionists, dissolve parliament and ask the country to decide the issue. The Liberals' caucus was practically a pre-election caucus. The government was heard and all declared that the result of an election would be the return of the government by an increased majority.

Many of the members expressed the opinion that there should be an immediate dissolution and an end put to the farce of daily sessions with opposition obstruction, and no progress made. However, it was decided that their day in session until a late hour each night. There will be probably some twenty-five or thirty members attending for the purpose of either forcing reciprocity through or demonstrating to the electors how determined the opposition is to block it, and how impossible the position of the government is, thus justifying the calling of an election.

The Liberals confidently believe they will sweep the country. Reports from all parts of the dominion indicate a steadily growing demand for reciprocity.

In Quebec and the maritime provinces the farmers holding their hay for sale in the United States as soon as the reciprocity measure is law.

In the west the farmers with the 200, 000,000 bushels of wheat in sight are looking to the United States market more keenly than ever.

The fishermen and the lumbermen have been heard from in favor of the agreement and even the manufacturers are less militant against reciprocity than they were three months ago.

On the Conservative side there is still outwardly great confidence. They are relying on generous financial aid from the manufacturers to pull them through the election and to defeat the government. It has been publicly stated more than once, on account of the church pews which have been contributed to the war chest from British and American sources, and the more are expected.
