## AGAINST REPEAL OF BRITISH DUTIES

London, May 8.—Philip Snowden, Chancellor of the Exchequer, today received an industrial group of members of parliament, mostly Conservatives, who presented their case against repeal of the duties.

The Chancellor reserved his reply for Tuesday, but there was every indication that his stand was inflexible. The denunciation left his office seemingly convinced that he would not budge from his determination to abolish the duties on August 1.

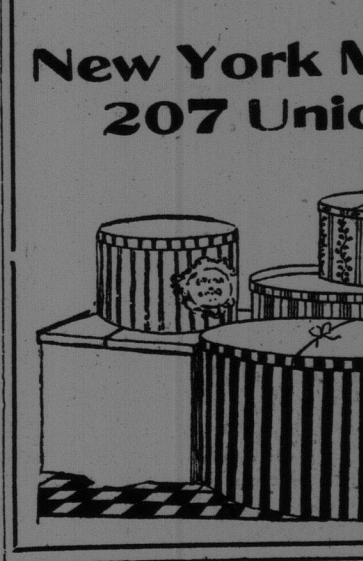

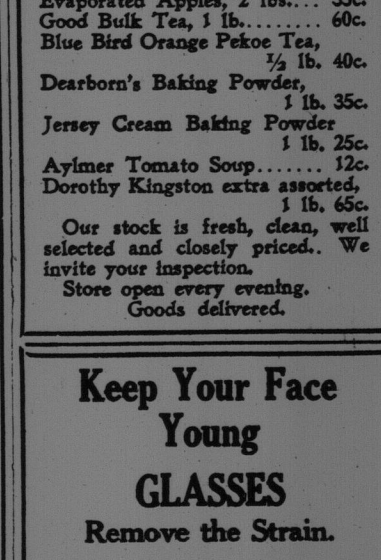
