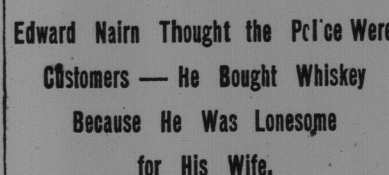

**UNITED STATES TROOPS  
BEATEN IN THE PHILIPPINES**

**Detachment Driven Back With Heavy Losses  
by a Large Force of Natives.**

MANILA, July 23.—A detachment of constabulary, Lt. Williams commanding, encountered a band of 600 Putanes near Buraen, on the island of Leyte (Sunday) morning. Lt. Worswick, twelve privates and civilian Scout McBride were killed.

The constabulary were driven back. The Putajanes secured 14 rifles and two revolvers. The bodies of Workwick, McBride and ten privates were recovered. Reinforcements of con-
