The Bill to extend the bounds of Charlotte was
postponed 3 months.

On motion of Mr. Doolittle a Committee
was appointed to correspond with the House
concerning the non-intermission to Light House
construction of Dartmouth, Kerr, Wilton, and Meductic
was appointed.

Progress was made in the Medical Bill.

Adjourned at 5.30.

Wednesday, March 5.

Two petitions presented against incorporation of
Dartmouth into Fredericton.

Bill was introduced by Gray for protection of
operating grounds. By Smith to abolish all forms
of Law relating to Highways as provides for no
assessment of non-resident lands.

A motion of Mr. Doolittle to rescind resolution of
2nd Feb., relating to prosecution of general
business.

Gray presented petition for money to repair
wharf at Indian Town. Referred to Board of
Works.

At 4.45 o'clock orders of the day the Revenue Bill
was taken up. Dr. Vail in Chair.

Prof. Somers presented petition of Bill. On
operating grounds, 60 ft. by 10 ft., 125 per cent.

instead of 50 ft. by 10 ft., before. When additional 25
per cent. Malted grain 12 1/2 per cent. Rail-
way iron of every description 1 per cent. for
general revenues. On Estimates 12 1/2 per cent.

increased between new Bill and the old one, would
raise the estimated Revenue from £105,000 as estimated

Wolcott went into general finances. He argued
that the new Bill did not affect the revenue, but
for interest of Debenture issued since November
was £50,000—namely, on funded debt £45,180,
floating debt £4,862, supposed Boring's Commis-
sion £16. This was the principal item in which
he disagreed with Tailey's general statement, differ-
ing in his particular.

We made out however, provided for being Ex-
penditure over Estimated Revenue £157,500 less
£3. I. condemned the principle of the altera-
tion in the Revenue Bill.

Mr. Tailey said the difference between Estimates
of Revenue and actual Expenditure was only
£15,000, or less, on Railways Expenditure

balance to credit of fund stand at the close of 1859,
£4,000.

JEAN PAUL RICHTER.—Prof. Mitchell of
Cincinnati, is delivering a series of lectures on
Astronomy in the Academy of Music of New
York. On Wednesday night at the close
of the fourth lecture of the course, Prof.
Mitchell stated that he never stood in the
presence of one of these wonderful instru-
ments [the telescope] but what he felt almost
as though he stood before a superior power
it seemed as though it were the eye of God
itself—so much did it reveal to man's limited
vision. He expressed the opinion that
the limit of his discoveries had not yet been
reached, and recited the following beautiful
passage from Jean Paul Richter, with great
satisfaction that it seemed to him as though

And to his angels who stood about his
throne he said, 'Take him, strip him of his
robes of flesh; cleanse his afflictions; put a
new breath into his nostrils; but touch not
his human heart—the heart that fears and
hopes and trembles. A moment and it was
done, and the man stood ready for his un-
known voyage. Under the guidance of a
mighty angel, with sound of flying pinions,
they sped away from the battlements of
heaven. Some time on the mighty angel's
wing they fled through spheres of darkness,
wildernesses of death.—At length, from
a distance not counted save in arithmetic of
heaven, light beamed upon them—a sleep
dawn as though seen through the hazy cloud. They
sped on in their terrible speed to meet
the light with lesser speed came to
meet them. In a moment the blazing of sun
around them a moment the wheeling of plan-
ets; then came long eternities of twilight;
then again on the right hand and on the left
appeared more constellations. At last the
man sank down, crying, 'Angel I can go no
further; let me lie down in the grave, and
hide myself from the infinitude of the uni-
verse, for end there is none.' End is there
none? demanded the angel. And from the
glittering stars that shone around there came
a shrill shout, 'End there is none!' End
there is none? demanded the angel again;
and tristitia that ays thy soul? I answer,
and there is none to the universe of God.
Lo, so, there is no beginning."
