THE BIBLE ALL CHRISTIANS

Unity Foundation Headed By Bishop Courtney, Formerly Of Nova Scotia, Hopes To Harmonize World.

New York, July 19.—Twenty-four Episcopalians, fourteen of them resident in the United States, incorporated here yesterday a plan to bring about organic union of the Christians of all the world, Protestant and Roman Catholics.

The Christian Unity Foundation is the name of the society. It is patterned upon the Sage Foundation, purposing to place at the service of Christianity the same methods that are employed by the Sage and similar research foundations. The new scheme is unlike the Federal Council, organized here three years ago, for they seek cooperation without schisming organization.

Twelve of the twenty-four men are laymen and twelve are bishops or half-presbyters. All schools of thought in the church are represented. Among the laymen are lawyers, scientists, business men, capitalists, and T. H. Homer, formerly secretary of the United States Army and Navy.

Six Clergymen. The six men in priest's orders are: the Rev. Dr. Wesley F. Alison, for many years rector of St. Ann's, Brooklyn, but lately retired to go around the world in the interests of missions; the Rev. Dr. George William Douglas and the Rev. Dr. Robert B. Jones, canon of the Cathedral of St. John the Divine; the Rev. Dr. H. R. Gummey, Jr., of Haddonfield, N. J.; the Rev. Dr. Arthur Lowndes, editor of the church's "Theology" and the Rev. Dr. T. H. Homer, formerly rector of the church of the Incarnation, but lately became rector of Grace Church, Jamaica, L. I.

The twelve laymen are Col. Charles W. Larned, of the military academy at West Point; Rear Admiral Caspar F. Goodrich, late commandant of the New York navy yard; R. Fulton Cutting, John M. Glenn, general agent of the Sage Foundation; Francis C. Huntington and lately elected into the vestry of Grace Church; George Gordon King of Newport and New York capitalist, who has lately become treasurer of the Episcopal general board of missions in succession to the late George C. Thomas; William Fellowes Morken, manufacturer and publisher, who lives at Summit, N. J.; George Wharton Pepper, who was counsel to Clifford K. Loring, formerly secretary of Mayor Gaynor's tax expert; Charles G. Saunders, a corporation lawyer of Boston; William Jay Schieffelin, president of the Citizens Union and John H. Stoughton, who was chief justice of the supreme court of Rhode Island until he resigned to run for congress but was defeated.

First Meeting in February. The first meeting to consider this project was held in St. Thomas's church, this city, on February 20 last. Bishop Courtney presided, and he will, after articles of incorporation are filed at Albany today, be elected president of the foundation. The chairman of the committee of research is to be the young rector of Grace Church, Jamaica, the Rev. R. T. Homans. George Gordon King will be chosen treasurer. It is stipulated that the officers of the foundation have underwritten the initial expenses up to \$10,000. A campaign for securing an endowment is to be entered upon, for it is recognized that a long and expensive task lies before the foundation.

It is announced that no publicity plan, no series of public meetings is to be entered upon. Research and conferences of leaders are to be the order. Information concerning the faith and works of religious bodies will be published. Methods of co-operation will be suggested. The evils of division will be pointed out. Conferences have already been held with Greek Catholics, and it is said to be the hope of the promoters that early this fall a meeting of leading Episcopalians and Presbyterians may be arranged. It is stated that greater hopes are held out of bringing Episcopalians and Presbyterians together than any other.

20,000,000 Represented. The federal council, already referred to, is a federation of all Protestant bodies, save only the Protestant Episcopal, altogether upward of 20,000,000 of Christians being represented in it. Its aim is to emphasize points of agreement, to enter upon work of these points, and through the avenue of usefulness to the world to bring about unity. Denominational questions and policies are not entered upon.

When the federal council idea was presented to the general convention of the Episcopal Church, that convention fearing the explosive material that might be in it, dodged the proposition, by referring it to a commission on Christian unity. This commission co-operated but it does not officially represent much. Only two members of the commission, Bishop Anderson of Chicago and George Wharton Pepper of Philadelphia, are included in this new foundation.

There are now two distinct American movements looking to Christian union. One is the federal council, to which all non-Roman bodies adhere save the Greek Catholic and the Protestant Episcopal churches, and which seek unity by usefulness, and this new foundation, which would include Greek and Roman Catholic in the union, that on a line of doctrine and practice.

into consideration, too, and they are cheap lumber, cheap clothing and the general feeling that laws are enforced in a much better fashion in the Dominion of Canada than in the United States. They have here also better postal regulations, so that the farmer can do much of his shopping by mail.

First, the railroad will be built—this so that the farmers will be assured of a local market for their crops; then a school building will be started, and while all these preparations are under way, the many immigration agents in the United States will be "booking" Americans for these towns and the surrounding farm land for with the exception of a few towns to be laid out in the mineral districts, all will be built in the middle of fertile farm land.

Winnipeg, July 19.—Western Canada is building towns on a wholesale scale. The Government and the big transcontinental railroads working in harmony intend to lay out and populate 250 new towns in the next year, and a half; an average of three new towns will be placed on the map of Canada every week during the next 18 months.
