

Drive-Serbians Continue Victorious Progress in Mountainous Regions-British Artillery Checks Skir-

mishers Along Sturma Front.

Paris, Aug. 22 .- The Allied forces have captured a series of heights at of the Vardar river, on the Saloniki front, according to the offital report issued by the war office tonight. On both wings adv letachments have fallen back before the counter-offensive of the Bul-

The text of the statement follows

"The battle continued on August 21 on the whole front of the alied armies on the Saloniki line. In the centre the British-French forces have violently bombarded Bulgarian positions on both sides of the Lake Doiran, while our infantry established itself on the southern spurs of

"West of the Vardar our troops have occupied a line of heights near Ljumnica, and have maintained their positions at all points despite violent counter-attacks by the enemy.

"The Serbian army has continued its progress in the mountainous zone between the Cerna and Moglenica rivers. On the two wings the enemy, at the cost of very heavy losses, has succeeded in pushing back our advance detachments. On one end of the line the covering deich attacked on August 20 west of Seres, Bulgarian forces more than a division in strength, in order to delay their fallen back on the Struma. All the passages of the river are solidly held by the Allies. On the extreme left wing the Serbian army, after a very hot battle, lasting two days, which was undertaken to retard the advance of the right wing of the Bulgarians, has taken its principal defensive position in the neighborhood of Lake Ostrovo."

MORE ITALIANS AT SALONIKI.

New York, Aug. 22.—A news agency despatch from London says: "A second contingent of Italian troops has landed at Saloniki, according to despatches received in London today."

BRITISH GUNS DRIVE ENEMY BACK.

London, Aug. 22 .- British artillery has checked the advance of skirmishers of the Central Powers in a sector of the Struma front, 35 northeast of Saloniki, says an official statement on the operations in the Balkans, given out by the war office this evening. Working parties, entrenching opposite Kamarjan and Cavdarmah on the same front, were dispersed by the British artillery also, the statement adds. The statement says:

On the Doiran front the situation is unchanged. On the Struma front we destroyed the railway bridge at Angista station on Sunday.

"Our mounted troops, working in conjunction with the French, suc essfully located the enemy on a front extending from Seres to Savjak, (north of the Struma.) Yesterday morning advance enemy skirmishers toward Kopriva bridge were stopped by our artillery, which also persed enemy working parties entrenched opposite Kamarjan and Cavdarmah."

HUNS AND BULGARS IN MACEDONIA.

Berlin, Aug. 21, via London, Aug. 22,-Despatches received here from the Balkans indicate that the Germans and Bulgarians are advancing on the entire Macedonia front. There are no indications as to the objective of the Bulgarians on the eastern end of the fighting line, but the pinion is held here that General Sarrail's right flank may soon be hard pressed.

An immediate result of the Bulgarian offensive is that the Central


