### PREMIER OLIVER GIVES LIBERALS' VIEW ON LIQUOR

British Columbia Gov't Would Prohibit Sale of Liquor to All Under 21 Years.

### MUST SECURE HELP OF DOMINION POWERS

Manifesto is Issued by Premier Oliver as He Goes to the People in General Vote.

Vancouver, B. C., Nov. 4.—In an election manifesto issued yesterday by Premier Oliver, Premier and Liberal leader, deals with what in a general way will be the basis of moderation in connection with sales of liquor and which are the government's general plans if elected on December 11, regarding financial and railway questions. Other matters dealt with are taxation, loans, industrial development, land settlement and the treatment of returned soldiers.

### BOLSHEVIK DECREE REVEALS PENDING RUSSIAN FAMINE

Lenine Confiscates All Food Stuffs and Labor to Transport Them to Railroad.

Washington, Nov. 4.—A Canadian newspaper from Scandinavia reports a decree issued by Nicolai Lenine and published in a Petrograd bolshevik organ which reveals the extreme to which the soviet government has been reduced to meet food requirements. Moscow wireless dispatches have declared the crop excellent.

The Lenine decree is directed to all food administrative headquarters and sets forth nine extraordinary measures which are compelled to be promulgated by the scarcity of food and impending famine. The nine measures are: 1. All horse labor in Russia is confiscated in order to get grain and potatoes to the nearest railway station. 2. That the above measure may be carried out strictly, and for other extraordinary duties, special local committees of three shall be created by the chairman of provincial food commissariats, one member of which shall represent labor and one the military. 3. This committee of three shall make a complete survey of all grain and potatoes in its own district and see that the maximum amount is available for transportation to the nearest railway station. 4. An administration of horse transportation shall be created in each province. 5. All grain shall be transported immediately to the nearest railway station. 6. No delay in the loading of grain on cars shall be tolerated, and there shall be no local distribution. 7. The committee of three shall have authority to call out food detachments to enforce the gathering of grain and potatoes, and, if needed, the military shall be called upon to enforce this decree.

For instance, before the war public debt was \$332,000,000 now it is \$2,200,000,000. Yet nobody in Canada begrudged that increase. There was also the great problems of taxation. History shows that it is not the amount of taxation but the manner of imposing taxation which counts.

### LAMB SKINS CHEAPER BUT MEAT DEARER

Montreal, Nov. 4.—Lambskins have fallen 90 per cent. in price, according to butchers here, and this fall is responsible for the high cost of lamb. While this should effect the cost of gloves and shoes, it has had the result of making the rest of the carcass dearer. Unusually heavy export to the United States is another factor in the high cost of lamb.
