Canada-Wide Series of Meetings

Stumping Tours by Both Liberals and Tories

The Possibility of a General Election Being Held in Canada in the Coming Fall—It is Contingent Upon Two Things.

Ottawa, May 21—Politics, like the weather, will be warm in Canada during the next two months. The word has gone out from the leaders of both political parties for an active campaign in all constituencies on the reciprocity issue, pending the reassembling of parliament on July 18, for the final effort of the government to secure the ratification of the agreement before adjournment on Friday they consented to grant an interim supply bill, just before the adjournment, to enable the opposition to hold up the government's programme any longer than is absolutely necessary, should the government advance the country and the word has gone out that the Liberal members are to perfect their organizations at once and be ready for a sudden election, if need be, at any time after the house meets again.

Election literature, with reciprocity as the main theme, is now being prepared by both sides, and it is expected that the Liberal organization has arranged for some 300 meetings. The cabinet ministers will take charge of their respective provinces and will be absent from the capital most of the time between now and July 18th.

Mr. Borden starts on June 15 for a hurried tour of the prairie provinces, addressing some thirty meetings in three weeks, his meetings will be offset by Liberal meetings now being arranged for all the western constituencies.
