

COURSE OF INSTRUCTION.

LANGUAGES: ANCIENT—Latin, Greek.
MODERN—French, German.

MATHEMATICS: Pure and Mixed.

NATURAL SCIENCE.

ENGLISH AND COMMERCIAL: Composition, History, Geography, Elocution, Book-Keeping, Music, Drawing, Gymnastics, Drill.

The above courses are divided into Three Departments:—

I.—THE CLASSICAL DEPARTMENT.

II.—THE MODERN AND SCIENTIFIC DEPARTMENT.

III.—THE JUNIOR DEPARTMENT.

(1.) In the CLASSICAL DEPARTMENT all those branches of knowledge are taught which are necessary to prepare Pupils for the Universities and the Learned Professions.

(2.) In the MODERN AND SCIENTIFIC DEPARTMENT, the Course of Study embraces less Classics and more Mathematics, Modern Languages, English Literature, History, Geography (including Physical and Political), Composition and Book-Keeping.

Pupils are prepared for the Competitive Examinations for admission at Woolwich and Sandhurst, for direct Commissions in the ARMY AND NAVY; for the CIVIL SERVICE, and for Mercantile Pursuits. Also, for the GILCHRIST SCHOLARSHIP, value 100*l.* sterling per annum, and tenable for three years; open to all candidates who shall either be natives of the Dominion Canada, or reside there three years immediately preceding the Examination.
