


## **Editor's Talk**


HERE is a very brief article on page 7 of this issue showing the kind of people that are going into the Canadian melting pot. This year's immigration will eclipse all previous records. In spite of the fact that the world does not know as yet whether Canada is to have a navy the people continue to come, from many sources.

It is the duty of Canadianism to assimilate these peoplewithout too much politics. It is the duty of Canadian newspapers and periodicals to reach as many kinds of people as possible with as many things of national interest as possible. The "Canadian Courier" has reflected as much of the new life and as many of the new peoples of Canada as any other two papers in the country. This has been done for two reasons: that older Canadians might know as much as possible about the people who were coming to learn Canadianism; and that new Canadians might be able to get a national outlook upon the life and character of this country.

In a country that changes the character of its population as rapidly as Canada, there is no place for a paper that fails either to be fundamentally Canadian, or to adapt itself to the life of the country. Politicians sometimes change their policies. An editor frequently changes his outlook.
