of the second part.

Whereas it has been ascertained by a survey made on behalf of the Superintendent General that the Releasor, owing to the absence of visible boundaries of the Whycocomagh Indian Reserve in Cape Breton, in the Province of Nova Scotia, has trespassed u on the said reserve and made certain improvements thereon.

And thoreas these improvements have been valued on tchalf of the Superintendent General by a competent valuator at the sum of \$270.00 which sum the Superintendent General, while not admitting that the Releasor is entitled to the same. is willing to pay the Releasor in compensation for such said improvements.

And whereas the Releasor is willing to accept the said sum in full of all claims and demands whatsoever and to surrender up the said lands.

Now These Presents w'tness that the Releasor, in consideration of the sum of \$270.00 now prid to him by the Superintendent General, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, doth for himself his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns hereby remise, release and forever acquit and discharge the Superintendent General and his successors
