

RELEASE.

This Indenture, made this eleventh day of March,
1915.

Between Duncan McKinnon hereinafter called the Releasor
Whycoocomagh, N. S. of the first part,
and

His Majesty King George the Fifth as represented by the
Superintendent General of Indian Affairs hereinafter called
the Superintendent General

of the second part.

Whereas it has been ascertained by a survey
made on behalf of the Superintendent General that the Releasor,
owing to the absence of visible boundaries of the Whycoocomagh
Indian Reserve in Cape Breton, in the Province of Nova Scotia,
has trespassed upon the said reserve and made certain improve-
ments thereon.

And whereas these improvements have been valued
on behalf of the Superintendent General by a competent valu-
ator at the sum of \$270.00 which sum the Superintendent General,
while not admitting that the Releasor is entitled to the same,
is willing to pay the Releasor in compensation for such said
improvements.

And whereas the Releasor is willing to accept
the said sum in full of all claims and demands whatsoever and
to surrender up the said lands.

Now These Presents witness that the Releasor,
in consideration of the sum of \$270.00 now paid to him by
the Superintendent General, the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged, doth for himself his heirs, executors, adminis-
trators and assigns hereby remise, release and forever acquit
and discharge the Superintendent General and his successors
