We have been honoured with your Ex^{ty}s of 22nd ultimo. only Receipt whereof we acquainted Coll. Houston & Coll. Diddley that we were directed by your Ex^{ty} to give them all the assistance that lay in our power in their journey to Canada which they took kindly. they sett out from home with Col. John Schuyler on the 6th instant

We lately received a letter from Capt. Harmer vedon out of the Seneca Country who tells us of Jean Coeur the french Interpreter and fur men with him and at y^e little Seneca Castle called Onnabee to winter there and that in the spring he is to go to Sagoy. he had reported that vedon had orders to kill him the Indians inquired whether it was true. he Replyd he had no such orders. but if he deserved it he would dispatch him. we have no more to add at present but that we are with much respect
