made a strong plea for Socialism and refused to be a further candidate for the presidency. Charles Moyer was elected president, Haywood was re-elected secretary. Moyer and Haywood were both advocates of Socialism Father Hagerty who had been a priest and who had outlined the plan of industrial unionism which was finally adopted by the I. W. W., an entirely different mxxxxixxxixxxalignment of the various crafts from what had obtained before. Whatker the campaign of 1902 in Colorado was fought out, the miners conducting a separate political campaign for the Socialist ticket where before they had supported the Democratic ticket. As a result James H. Peabody was elected Governor and a Republican legislature selected. The intolerance of the organized men in these districts was instanced in the case of some Austrian workmen who came to Victor in July, 1903. These men were escorted from the city by several union miners under the plea of finding them work on the railroad. Arriving at Hollywood they were told to keep on going and not come back, and after they had gone some distance a volley of revolver shots was sent after them. This instance is important and should be borne in mind in connection with the deportations that came a year later when it was the other side's turn to do the deporting.

In the spring of 1903 the mines at Colorado City refused to recognize the mill men's union there which was affiliated with the Western Federation of Miners and after some negotiations they went on
