He added that he had no doubt they would do so, but went on to point out that the proceedings of the Committee would show that there never had been any refusal to hear Mr. McCullagh, but that Mr. McCullagh had never made an application to be heard, and the Committee felt no obligation whatsoever to pay him the compliment of selecting him from among other citizens of Canada as a specially qualified witness.
