

make the removing of said a general
 thing, and he sees no reason why all
 the Indians who wish to engage in
 the business should not be permitted
 to do so, providing no injury is thereby
 done to Indian property.

Before any Band is removed however
 it would be advisable to insist upon
 a written permit being obtained from
 you for doing so and you should before
 giving such permit assure yourself that
 it can be done without injury to property.

You will inform the Indians to the
 above effect and that you are instructed
 to collect from the Indians engaged
 in the work 30 Cents for every hundred
 bushels of Band removed, which will
 be credited to the general account of
 the Band.
