On the 4th of March 1873 a license to cut timber and sawlogs was issued to Mr. David Moore, assignee of Mr. J. G. Ross, the assignee of Duncan Sinclair, covering the easterly 20 square miles of the Indian Reserve No. 10 on the northerly side of Lake Nipissing; the westerly 88 square miles constitutes another Timber Limit assigned to J. R. Booth 20th May, 1881.

On the 20th of July, 1874, a license was granted to Hon. Wm. Muirhead for the westerly 88 square miles of Reserve No. 10, who assigned to David Moore 28th November, 1879, who assigned to Mr. John R. Booth 17th December, 1889. On the 5th of October, 1891 a license covering 108 square miles of the Nipissing Reserve was issued to John R. Booth to cut pine timber and sawlogs of not less than nine inches in diameter at the stump.

Under date of 5th of January last the Department informed Mr. J. R. Booth that, as there was not much pine remaining on the Nipissing Limit, of which he was the licensee, and considering the time it had remained under license, the Department had decided to renew it to the 30th of April next, then to cease and determine.
