In reply to your letter of the 30th December last, addressed to the Secretary of the Interior Department, and which has been transferred to this Department, asking for information in regard to the balance payable on the W. Sec. 5, I9, 28, & the N.E. Sec. 36, I8, 29, Gambler's Reserve, near Biinscarth, Man. I have to inform you that the unpaid balance of purchase money against the first named land is \$1040.00, and the unpaid balance of purchase money against the last named land is \$336.00, or a total of \$1376.00, together with Interest thereon @ 6 % from date of Sale to date of payment. The first named land was sold on the 8th June, I90I, and the last named land was sold on the 2Ist May, I902.

I might add that payment may be made in full of this balance together with Interest thereon as above stated, but in order to obtain Patent, it will be necessary to furnish a Statutory proof of one year's residence upon the land, which was a condition of the Sale.
