Sir,-

In reply to your letter I have to say that the Department regrets that it is unable to furnish you with the names of the Indians who were members of the Scugeg band in 1843 when Scugeg Island was purchased by that band.

A statement regarding these Indians was received from Mr. T. G. Anderson, Indian Agent, in 1844, which gives the number of the Scugeg Indians as 86, - 1 Chief, 22 warriors, 14 boys and 17 girls. - 86 in all, but the names of those who compose this number are not given. The earliest list of the Indians in question in the hands of the Department is contained in the interest pay-list for the year 1855.
