

benefit. The timber was sold to the Nicola Pine Mills Co.and a first payment is being made of \$5000.00 which will be promtly distributed among the Indians of the Coldwater band. The interest of the Indians are being fully protected and the Department is prepared to consider their wishes by making distribution to the consider their wishes by making distribution to the Indians of a proportion of the money received from the sale of the timber up to 50% if desired.
