The price of range boilers was recently marked down 50 cents, the reduction being the result of United States competition. Many sizes of iron pipe have been advanced owing to scarcity of stock.

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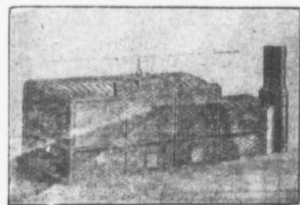
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
