III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the said Superintendant of Provincial Post-Houses, shall name and appoint persons, under the name of Maures and Aides de Postes, to keep the said Post-Houses, for such space of time and therement in conformity to fuch flipplations, as shall be agreed upon between the said Superintendant and the faid perfons, for the due execution of this Act, and according to the true f nfc and meaning thereof, and for the greater advantage and convenience of Trancliers, which time shall not nevertheless exceed the duration of this Act. Provided always, that when the Post shall drive on one side of any river only, nothing in this Act contained, shall be considered as compulsory or obligatory on the laid Superintendant, to name or appoint any Aide de Poste, there.

> IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every Maitre de-Peffe, between the Cities of Queb c and Montreal, respectively, shall be provided with two able men Servanis or Postillions, and shall have at least four good horses with four strong and convenient carioles and a like number of caleches, with iron criques or iprings and leather traces; also, sour sets of good and complete harnels, with two fleighs, two carts and one faddle; and every Aide de Poste shall be provided with one able man fervant or postillion, and at least two good horses with two fets of good and complete harnels, two carioles and two caleches, one fleigh and one cart; and that every Maître and Aide de Poste between Montreal and Côteau du Lac, on the North Shore of the River St. Lawrence; between Quebec and Trois Pistoles on the South Shore of the said River, and within and between the Town of William Henry and St. Johns, and in other parts of the Province, where Post-Houses shall be cstab ished, shall be provided with, that is to say, each Maitre de Poste at least one able man Servant or Postillion, and two good horses, with an equal number of good and complete harnels, carioles and calcenes, and one fleigh and cart, and one faddie: and each aide de Poste, with one able man Servant or Postillion, and also, one good horse, and at least one good and complete harness, and one: carrole, one calcche, one fleigh, and one cart,

Mattres and Aides de Parle to furmish horses and when carringes required.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every Maure and Aide de Peste, shall furnish immediately and without delay, upon being thereunto required by travellers, horses with carriages or horses with harnels for the carriage or carriages of such travellers, or saddle horses; and shall not retard travellers more than a quarter of an hour in the day time, and half an hour in the night time, and shall. convey the faid travellers with speed, at the rate of at least two leagues an hour, to the next Post House, and shall be bound to put good and sufficient reins to each and every horse, they shall so furnish and harness to luch carriage or carriages.

VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every Maitre and Aide de Poste may demand and receive from each traveller, for every league or in proportion for every part of a league, that he shall convey such traveller, the the different prices and rates which follow, that is to fay, for the hire of a horse and caleche, or a horse and cariole or of a horse, with the harness to put to the caleche or cariole of such traveller, for one person, the sum of One Shilling and three pence current money of this Province; for two persons, the sum of One Shilling and eight pence, like money, for every additional horse that any traveller or travellers shall require
