IS AIMING AT BEER EVENINGS

Kaiser Has Non-Alcoholic Drinks Sold to Men at Reduced Prices.

BERLIN, July 16.—Gen. Ven Deimling, commander of the fifteenth army corps, has recently ordered that non-alcoholic drinks be sold at the canteens for the same or lower prices than alcoholic drinks, has issued a new temperance order. He refers to the habit of holding "beer evenings" following certain corps events, the cost of which is

paid from the canteen surplus, and says: "I am of the opinion that the soldiers would enjoy it more if the available funds were used for an excursion, for instance, to the battlefield of Worth. The officers could give commonly understood speeches, and milk, coffee or other non-alcoholic drinks could be served. Whoever feels that he could not exist without alcohol could pay for it out of his own pocket. "The soldiers would be more grateful to their superior officers for such excursions than for beer evenings. The recollections of those would persist pleasantly, where as the recollections of beer evenings end with a passing of the katzenjammer due to new temperance order. General Von Deimling says he believes that his order will serve to banish the practice, rooted in the anti-

quated and false belief that one can only be happy when he has wine or beer to drink. Movies Now Army Target The moving picture has been turned to account by the army. It is likely that a portion of the soldier's rifle range work will be done hereafter with moving figures for targets. A test of the new contrivance at the Doberitz range gave good results. The Emperor, who witnessed the test and fired several shots, was pleased with the innovation. Long rolls of paper replaced the usual film and on them appeared marching soldiers, cavalrymen, artillery in full gallop, cycle troops and other moving objects. The instant a bullet struck the paper the spot of impact was brilliantly lighted, and the movement of the contrivance was arrested nearly a second, giving an opportunity to see the full effect of the shot. It is believed the invention will prove valuable in training the soldiers to aim and fire rapidly and with better effect. Kaiser's Heir Plans Trip The Kaiser's consent has been obtained by the Crown Prince for an extended trip through Germany's colonies next summer. The Crown Prince had planned to make the trip this year, and the question of asking the Reichstag to appropriate \$45,000 for the expenses had been broached when it was announced that the Kaiser had decided to resign permission for the journey. Several reasons were given for the decision, among them being that the ruler's feeling that insufficient measures had been taken to insure the Prince's safety. These objections, it is reported, have been removed.

The big question now is whether the Reichstag will vote necessary funds. The Socialists will, of course oppose the idea, and it is more than possible that enough of the others will join to block the appropriation. Whether this would result in cancelling the trip cannot be foretold. Acting Mayor Blumenthal Transacts Big Business in His Worship's Absence.
