Pioneer of County Gave Interesting Reminiscences Some Time Ago

Simcoe, Oct. 31.—(From our own correspondent)—The remains of the late Mahlon N. Collier were laid to rest at Bloomsbury yesterday, under a chill and murky sky, in the presence of a large gathering of relatives, friends and former neighbors, and almost all of the surviving members of his family.

Early Days in Simcoe.
Interviewed on June 28th, 1917, by our North Ward Representative, to whom we are indebted for the following reminiscences, Mr. Collier spoke in substance, as follows: I was born on Sept. 13th, 1822, My father's name was Timothy Collier. He was the son of Aaron Collier.

When Governor Simcoe came to Brantford, as Simcoe was then called, (1793) my grandfather was living in Toronto. Timothy Collier lived when he died. There was no grist mill in that neighborhood then, and grandfather wanted to build a mill but he had not yet got the privilege for water power from the Crown.

It was for the purpose of getting this that he went to the Governor, when he with his staff and nine attendants were encamped under a tree in what is now Lynnwood Park. (The historic tree still stands.)

Watermills Worth a Farm.
Grandfather took along with him some watermills, which he gave to the Governor. He found that the party had not enough bread to put them through to Brantford, so he sent over to the farm and got some for him. The Governor gave him 200 acres of land, the westerly portion of which comprises all that part of Simcoe east of Norfolk street, between Stanley and Towline street.

ENEMY OWNED PATENTS FOR U.S. MANUFACTURERS
Great Store of German Scientific Knowledge Placed at the Disposal of American People by Regulation of Federal Trade Commission

Washington, Oct. 30.—The vast store of German scientific information in this country was opened today to American manufacturers as regulations issued by the Federal Trade Commission under which enemy-owned patents and copyrights will be licensed for manufacture by citizens of the United States.

When the regulations had been made public, they were hailed by medical men of certain drugs, principally salvarsan, used in venereal blood diseases, and toxic substitutes for local anesthetics, of which the supply in this country has run dangerously low since the war interrupted commerce.

Germany thought for many years had been in the forefront of medical research, evolving remedies for disease and for alleviation of pain, all of which, patented in the United States, will now become available to and suffering in this country.

It was said today to be likely that any license issued for the manufacture of salvarsan would carry the suggestion that a certain amount be turned over to the Public Health Service.

Guard Against Exploitation.
Whether prices for drugs manufactured under license will be determined by the commission was not announced, but it was intimated that the commission would safeguard the public against exploitation.
