Educational Laws

One of the latest laws promulgated by Ontario's Minister of Education requires that public school inspectors nust attend a school to be opened in Toronto. As inspectors receive such large salaries they won't mind the little item of expense involved in this.

The duties of all Public School in pectors will be materially increased At regular intervals they will be called upon to meet the Trustee Boards and fully discuss all educational matters, and at least once in each year they must call a public meeting in each township and invite trustees and rate

The possibility of securing extension of teachers' certificates is to be made much more remote. In future ere a school can avail itself of an extended certificate it must submit to the Department a statement from the Board and inspector showing the efforts made to secure a qualified teacher and the salary offered. It will then be neces sary to advertise a second time, and, if able offer a higher salary. No inspector can in future grant an exten on of certificate without the approval of the Minister of Education.

Nor this purpose a large, perfectly flatistioneds provided, and upon it is eventy-squand a sheet of the foll without crack or one-eighth of an inch with clean mer-cury. The plate of glass, perfectly cleaned from all grease and impurity is floated on to the mercury by shifting so as to exclude all air bubbles. It then pressed down by loading it with weights in order to press out all the mercury which remains fluid. This is received in a gutter around the stone After about twenty-four hours it is gently raised upon its edge, and in few weeks it is ready to frame.
