### REXALL One Cent Sale at London To Be Able To Talk To Berlin Over Telephone

Although Berlin & less than 600 miles from London a telephone con versation between the British and German capitals will be made possible soon for the first time. At present Paris and Brussels with occasional service to a few Swiss towns represent the extreme Contin ental limits to which one may tele phone from London.

Two years ago a telephone cable was laid from the Suffolk coast to Holland but this as well as the ad ditional cable laid last year was in suffcient to cope with the traffic. Now a third cable is expected to handle all direct conversations with Holland and leave some circuits free to connect with Berlin.

Inasmuch as the German capital already has telephonic connection with the Scandinavian countries be fore many months London should be able to get Copenhagen. Stock holm and Christianla on the line. Service between London and Constantinople is the ultimate dream of British post office dengineers but although this distance is much less than than from New York to San Franc'sco no attempt ever has been made to bridge it by telephone.
