PROGRAMME OF SIXTH WEEK.

HIGH WATER MARK OF ATTENDANCE AT CLIFF HAVEN.

The high-water mark of attendance for the session of 1900 was reached this week at Cliff Haven. Nearly every room on the grounds is filled, and all are engaged long in advance. There will be no cessation, it seems, until the close on the 31st of August.

For the second time during the present session, Pontifical Mass was celebrated in the new chapel. The officiating prelate was Rt. Rev. John M. Farley, D. D., Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of New York. He was assisted by Rev. Gabriel Holy as assistant priest, Rev. J. J. Donah, of Brooklyn, as deacon, Rev. W. Courtney, of New York as sub-deacon, Don McKenna of New York and Rev. Fr. O'Brien, S. J., of Montreal, as deacons of honor. The Reverend President Father Lavelle, served as Master-of-Ceremonies.

The scheduled preacher Rt. Rev. Mgr. Mooney, V. G., LL. D., of New York, was unable to be present on account of the death of one of his fellow-priests, so in his place he sent one of his assistants, Rev. John D. Roach, of the Sacred Heart Church, New York City. By this act, the student at Cliff Haven were not only not allowed to suffer disappointment, but were also privileged to listen to one of the most brilliant of the young priests of the Archdiocese. Father Roach took the text of his sermon from the Gospel of the day, and drew from it lessons that were particularly applicable to the congregation. The beauty of his thoughts and the fervor which he imparted to his words appealed directly and forcefully to his hearers. It was an eloquent and powerful sermon that made a deep impression on all fortunate enough to hear it.

Every person at present at Cliff Haven is not only willing, but eager to acknowledge the fact that the sixth week of the session of 1900 is unsurpassed in the history of the School in all ways, but particularly in regard to its intellectual attractions. During the week, five splendid courses of study have been offered, one in Shakespeare's Macbeth, one in Dante's Paradise, one in the Philosophy of Theism, one in Logic and one in French and Italian Art. To decide which one or ones are the best is a wholly impossible task, for each is worthy of high commendation for its individuality and intellectual value.

The third fortnightly period in the Shakespeare and Dante classes began this week, the former getting Very Rev. Herbert F. Farrell, V. F., of Westbury, L. I., and the latter Rev. Joseph Dalaney, D. D., of New York as instructors.

Both of these courses are of exceptional worth. Father Farrell possesses keen literary instinct and the power of successfully imparting knowledge, so that he makes the most of his opportunities and leads his class to get out of the great tragedy that which is most essential. Because of lack of time, he does not spend any long period on minor details, but confines himself to those points which best develop in the student the love for literature.

As a Dantean scholar, Dr. Dalaney has won a high place in the regard of Summer School people. He is gifted with a poetic temperament that enables him to see and to bring others to see the unparalleled beauties of thought and style that lie in

to the influence of the Catholic hierarchy, and that all the present trouble came from that, Cardinal Moran, of Sydney, said: "As a matter of fact, the decay of that wonderful power of Spain dates from the decline of its religious spirit. The height of Spain's glory was in the days of Charles V., when it was the most Catholic power in the world, but from the year 1700 up to the present internal dissensions and warring against the Church may be said to have been the distinctive features of the Spanish Government. Whatever Spain there is in Spain must be assigned to these political dissensions, and to constant combat against the Catholic Church. For instance, all the Church property throughout Spain has been confiscated by different political parties about half a dozen times since the year 1700. About the middle of last century a special war was directed against the religious bodies, when the Jesuits were all thrown into prison and their property seized by the government. As late as the year 1834 all the Catholic schools and seminaries were suppressed, and out of a hierarchy of 60 bishops, 50 were expelled from their sees and sent into banishment, while every penny of property belonging to the Church throughout Spain was appropriated for government purposes. That does not seem to indicate that the government of Spain is controlled by the Catholic hierarchy. To account for that spirit of hostility to the Church in the government of Spain, one has only to look to the Bourbon dynasty which occupied the Spanish throne in 1700. With this French influence in Spain the irreligious principles of the French court gained a mastery. The teachings of Voltaire guided for sixty years the policy of the Spanish government. Hence, though the people were intensely Catholic, and most fervent and devout in their Catholic exercises, the government was in open hostility to the Church. Spain has been undergoing a systematic robbery for years. When ever appropriations which would be for the betterment of the people have been made, the money, instead of being used for the purposes intended, has been pocketed by the unscrupulous, God-denying politicians. With such men at the head of a government, is it any wonder that the throne would totter?

The Western Watchman thus succinctly sums up the situation in Italy: "King Humbert met his death by the bullet of an assassin, and his only son, Victor Emmanuel, named for his grandfather, who invaded Rome, Italy is an impoverished country and it is of little consequence to the Italians who also them; but it is of great consequence to the interior of the great dome of the basilica of Montmartre, Paris. Humbert and his son have no rest, for M. Robilliard de Fligny says there are 400 strokes a minute nearly all day.

We regret to announce the death at the age of 72 of M. Henri Lasserre, the historian of Lourdes. He studied law in Paris, but under the Empire became a journalist and editor of the "Goussier." He wrote against Rome's "Vie de Jesus," and, having himself to have been carried from Lourdes by a bottle of Lourdes water, he became the patron of the Lourdes shrine, his book being translated into every known language. He also published a new French translation of the Bible, which is widely known, and was the author of M. de Fligny's "Le Lourdes," which has sold 1,000,000 copies.
