Baking a Bird in Clay. The most simple, and the most successful, method of baking a bird is in clay. Given a bright copper fire and a brick in condition, the process is as follows: Make a pliable cake of moist clay large enough to envelop the bird. Let it be about two inches thick. Smooth and flatten it on the upper side, but do not pull a feather or draw the bird. Push it tightly in the clay envelope and it takes the shape of, as it were, a smooth oblong clay ball. Dig a hole in the earth under the centre of the camp-fire and bury the bird with a covering of earth, ashes, and embers, about three inches deep.
