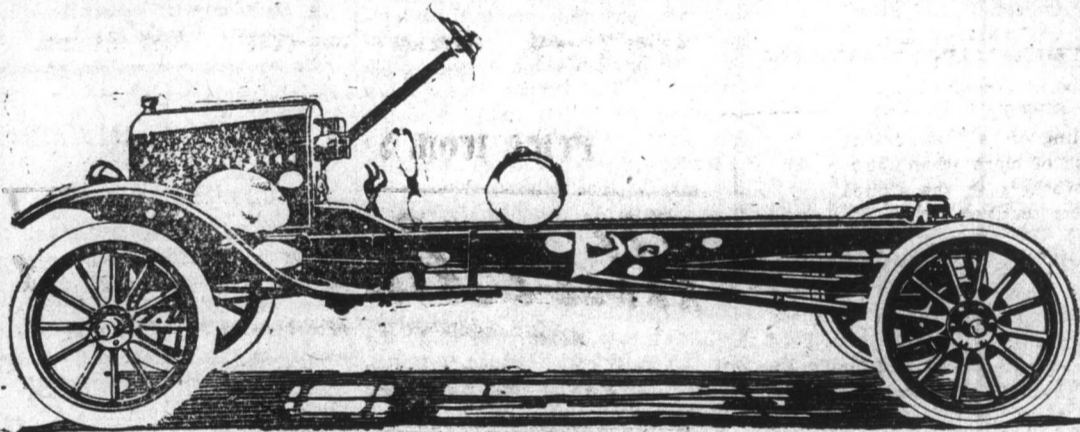

Saved Materials From the British.

GERMANS NAIVELY EXPLAIN WHY THEY DENUDE INDUSTRIES OF FRANCE AND BELGIUM.

That they found it necessary to remove materials and machinery from France and Belgium to prevent their destruction by the British is now brazenly being explained by German manufacturers through the General Union of Manufacturers and Exporters of Berlin and at the same time they explain that as the result of these removals they are in a position to fill orders with goods which cannot be obtained from any other source. Here is the way they put it in instructions to agents seeking export business:

The systematically brutal and inhuman methods pursued by the Franco-British armies in France and Belgium during the war, and particularly by the English, have brought about the total destruction by gunfire (destruction more than probably premeditated by the English) of all the factories, of all manufacturing centres, stocks of raw material, coal, lines of communication, rolling stock, in all the area which has served as the theatre of war.

Our civil and military services—horrified at the sight of such spectacles of systematic obstruction, which they were unable to avert, saw their way to lessen their intensity in some measure by transporting into German territory practically all the material to be found in the country occupied by our valiant armies.

We have thus been able to save from destruction stocks of raw materials and manufactured goods of inestimable value; these stocks remain at the complete disposal of manufacturers and our merchants.

In this manner our happy foresight has served to assure the populations of the world of the easy re-equipping of the globe in manufactured articles after the war, despite the fact that the savagery of the British troops nearly deprived them of that privilege. —The Financial Post.

Fat Fees.

LAWYERS' AMAZING INCOMES.

Law is a costly luxury. And well it might be, for the finest profession in the world from a money-making point of view is the law. In a recent case Sir Edward Carson and Sir John Sifton had a trifling fee of five thousand guineas on their briefs, each being assisted by a small army of juniors, who were paid in proportion. There are a round dozen leading lawyers who will not read a brief without a preliminary fee of one thousand guineas, while a leader of minor eminence now expects one hundred guineas on a brief and twenty-five guineas a day as a refresher.

The Bar is the strongest trade union in the country. It has forced legal incomes up by leaps and bounds, as may be gathered from the fact that Jessel, the one-time Master of the Rolls, looked upon twenty-five guineas refresher as something exceptional, while Edwin James chronicled as extraordinary two hundred guineas on a brief when he was the leading Queen's Counsel.

The biggest fees on record were those of ten thousand guineas which Serjeant Ballantine and Mr. Balfour Browne, K.C., each received for conducting cases abroad. And yet Ballantine only made four and a half guineas during his first year at the Bar, thirty guineas in the second, and seventy-five in the third.

Lord Birkenhead and Lord Reading have each made enormous fortunes at the Bar. The former, it is said, made a sacrifice of £10,000 a year when he became Lord Chancellor. And when he gets "the sack" a grateful country will give him an out-of-work pension of £5,000 a year. Which calls to mind the fact that Lord Halsbury, now in his 94th year, has drawn more public money than any living subject of the Crown. His modest earnings have been roughly £170,000 as Lord Chancellor for seventeen years, and £280,000 as ex-Chancellor for sixteen years—a total of £250,000.

Household Notes.

Boiling water removes tea stains. Never put meat on the ice, but near it.

Dry all brushes with the bristles downwards.

Rice water should be saved for starching.

Save all paraffin paper for lining cake tins.

Add acid fruits to ice cream after it is frozen.

Raw potato dipped in baking soda will clean silver.

Common vaseline will clean brass electric fixtures.

Common salt will remove egg stains from silver.

When a lamp gives a poor light, try boiling the burner.

To polish silverware rub it with whiting on chamois.

Ice cream is best made with cream two or three days old.

Salt curdles new milk if added before cooking the milk.

If heavy cream is whipped too long it will granulate.

Turpentine and hard rubbing will remove wax from cloth.

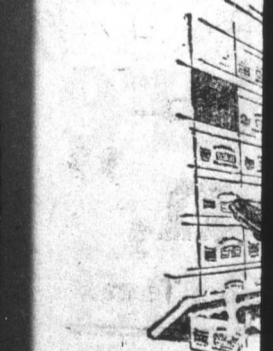
