Heard in Halifax.

ATLANTIC'S DRONING EASILY AUDIBLE.

Far away droning, audible only when the city's night roar lulled momentarily, indicated that the great Handley-Page biplane, in command of Vice-Admiral Kerr and in flight from St. John's, Nfld., to Atlantic City, was passing somewhere in the vicinity of Halifax at 2.30 o'clock this morning. This sound, so unlike any other sound of human activity, stole on the ear for a few minutes and then was gone again. The sky gave out no other sign of the aerial passenger, for low dark clouds hung low under the heavens, obscuring all lights which might otherwise have been seen.

The Handley-Page biplane passed over Glace Bay at 9.49 and Sydney at 9.52. She was reported over Antigonish at 11.30. At 1.30 the Barrington Passage wireless station was reported in touch with the big British dirigible R-34, which the Handley-Page will pass somewhere on its voyage, and will reach Mineola, New York, in time to welcome the lighter-than-air machine when it arrives.

Considerable interest was shown throughout the city in the passage of these airships. Many inquiries until a late hour were made over the wires to The Chronicle office, but it is doubtful if many others than the watchers on The Chronicle Building heard the passing of the air travelers.—Morning Chronicle, July 6.
