

Sept. 3rd.) At Premierland, London, last night Ted ("Kid") Lewis, the welter-weight and middle-weight boxing champi of Great Britain, knocked out Marcel Thomas, the ex-middle-weight champ-

ion of France, in the fourth round of

Thomas must have realized from the earliest seconds that his only chance of success lay in forcing Lewis out of his stride, and for quite four minutes his forcing tactics paid so well that Lewis was often on the retreat as he was on the aggressive.
