KING'S HEALTH IS GOOD

United States Reports to Contrary Are Incorrect.

London, April 22.—An investigation of reports circulated in the United States by a news agency that as a result of the alarming state of King Edward's health he had been ordered to take four days' rest at Naples before going to Rome, and that entertainment at Rome had been curtailed.

King left Malta in good health and there has been no change in his plans for curtailment of the Rome programme. It is announced that the King will arrive at Naples on April 27, and proceed to Rome April 27, originally arranged. A telegram from Rome this afternoon describes the preparations for King Edward's reception.
