A.—1 Two eggs, 1 cup white sugar, 1 heaping tablespoonful butter, 2-3 cups scraped chocolate, ½ cup boiling water poured over chocolate, ½ cup soling water poured over chocolate, ½ cup sweet milk, 1½ cups flour, 2 teaspoonful baking powder, 1 teaspoonful vanilla, bake in layers or oblong pan. If in layers, use this filling; 2-3 cup milk, yolk of one egg, well beaten, pinch of salt, sugar to taste, flavor with vanilla. Let boil and thicken with cornstarch. 2 The answer depends, of course, on the way the question is put. To say "Thank you," or "I shal be glad of your company," is quite sufficient, ordinarily.


