Greek Capital Has Been Thrown
Into a State of Terror by
Prussian Agents.

DEATH TO THE VENIZELISTS

Friends of Allies Were Mauled,
Beaten and Done To
Death.

New York, Dec. 7.—A special cable to the Herald from Athens, via London dated Wednesday says:

"Encouraged and applauded by Princess Ypsilanti and other women royalists, regular troops have thrown Athens into a state of terror. Officers, under orders of one general wearing the grand cordon of the Redeemer, are imitating the Prussians in an effort to strike fear into the hearts of the sympathizers of Venizelos. Elderly men are being driven from their homes and tortured, as they are marched through thoroughfares. Two Greek Red Cross nurses were locked up in a filthy latrine and assaulted by their guards. Homes of prominent men known to have openly criticized the king's policy have been looted. Women occupants were made to suffer gross indignities as they ran to refuge.

Shot in Couples.
"On orders from a general high in the king's favor Venizelist prisoners have been led through the streets in couples to be shot."

When the chief personnel of the ministry of war was asked about this and told that it was true members of the Government would be held responsible, he positively and earnestly denied it.

Threats to shoot Mr. Katapothalis, London Morning Post correspondent, have been made by royalist troops, and they are now trying to capture him. He is translator to the American legation, where he has taken refuge, and the American minister is trying to protect him. For two days troops have been systematically firing on his private residence, where his sister and her maid are alone. The home of Mr. Venizelos has been sacked. Not a single shot was fired from the house, and no provocation given to the soldiers. The attack on the house was conducted entirely by regular troops under superior officers. After the house had been fired upon by machine guns without any resistance whatever being offered ten Cretans in it were taken prisoner and walked off to an unknown destination. The place was then sacked, and all Mr. Venizelos's furniture, valuables and wearing apparel were taken away in wagons guarded by regular troops.

Shots From Palace.
"The home of Mr. Benachi, mayor of Athens, was fired upon by soldiers from the windows of the palace of Prince Ypsilanti, King Constantine's master of horse, and from the house of M. Pexomazou, who was present himself, with Mr. Merkurius.

Princess Ypsilanti, a Hungarian, encouraged the soldiers, and the house eventually was broken into and Mr. Benachi, a man 73 years old, was brought out. He was spat upon, and when soldiers prodded the aged man with bayonets, blood was streaming from his head and on his clothes were other signs of wounds. A loud laugh was heard from several women with Princess Ypsilanti when two soldiers tore part of the beard from the aged man's face, and even a Royalist was heard to remark: "That's barbarity. It would be better to kill him."

Mayor's House Wrecked.
Mr. Benachi, suffering from his wounds, was dragged through the streets to be examined. He was permitted to accompany a friend to his home. His house is wrecked and looted, and not a window remains unbroken. Every hour of the day, one sees an unfortunate Venizelist being dragged through the streets. Only this morning one of the protesting prisoners was stood up against the wall of a house and shot by troops. His body was quickly carted away by the police, who are acting with the soldiers.

This state of terror in a country where only a minority of the population is in sympathy with the central powers has been worked up by Prussian agents, who believe in any means to accomplish their end, but it is an idea which they will rue, according to the masses.

TAKES USUAL STAND
OVER THE ARABIA

Germany Says Sinking Legitimate, But Is Ready to Make Amends.

Washington, Dec. 7.—Germany, in a note made public by the state department today, contends that the British steamer Arabia, sunk in the Mediterranean on November 6, was in reality a transport ship for troops in the service of the British Government, which it is to be considered as an auxiliary warship, according to international law, and can, therefore, be treated like a warship.

The German Government's attitude, however, like that in the Marina case, is expressed to be one of readiness to make amends if it be shown that the submarine commander violated Germany's pledges to the United States.

Petrograd Reports Bucharest Evacuated and Ferdinand's
Troops Retiring To Eastward—Berlin Reports the
City of Campino Captured.

Petrograd, Dec. 7.—Via London.—Bucharest, the Rumanian capital, has been evacuated by the Rumanian troops, says the Russian official statement issued today, and the Rumanian forces to the south of the capital also have retired. In Wallachia the Rumanians are retreating towards the east under hostile pressure and holding the Teuton forces by rearguard actions.

TEUTONS TAKE CAMPINO.
Berlin, Dec. 7.—Via London.—The defeated Rumanians are retreating along the whole front, the war office announces. The Teutonic troops have captured Campino, on the railroad between Kronstadt and Ploechti. In yesterday's fighting more than 9,000 Rumanians were captured.

MADE THEIR ARMY.

New York, Dec. 7.—A news agency dispatch from Paris says:

"The Rumanians evacuated Bucharest in good order, saving their army, it was authoritatively stated here today.

"The Rumanian rearguard was forced to fight strenuously to cover the retreat."

Berlin, Dec. 7.—Via Sayville.—The German official statement issued today reads:

"Eastern front: Front of Princes Leopold, west of Lutsk, on the Luga, German and Austro-Hungarian detachments entered a Russian outpost position. The Russian forces were driven back, and the German forces were able to capture the position."

During the night the position was maintained in the face of five attacks. West of Zalozec and Tarnopol (Galicia), our troops were able to deliver 90 prisoners from one part of a captured Russian line and 25 from another, on their return."

In the Carpathians.
"Rumanian front: Front of Archduke Joseph. In the wooded Carpathians and on the front of the Moldavian Mountains there was a temporary increase in artillery fire and advance skirmishes, which were cleared up by the German forces north of Dorna-Watra and in the Trotus Valley. These were repulsed.

Courageous fighting spirit and a tenacious will for victory caused the troops to come attacked and conquered to respond to a call to arms. The German forces are in a position to take the city of Campino and Sinala, within a few days.

FRENCH DEPUTIES IN
SECRET SESSION AGAIN

Paris, Dec. 6.—(Delayed.)—The Chamber of Deputies held a ninth secret session today at the conclusion of which the doors were unlocked. After deliberation it was decided to hold an early brief session at 2 o'clock tomorrow at which motions arising out of the war of secret discussion will be examined. This session will be followed by a public one, at which the motions will be debated and voted upon.

STIFFEST TASK OF
HIS CAREER FACES
THE NEW PREMIER

Lloyd George Has Unionist Leaders With Him, but Not Old
Liberal Guard—Law, Church, Milner, Curzon, Carson,
Smith and Derby are Guesses for Make-up of
the New Cabinet.

London, Dec. 7.—The London Morning Post, in an editorial, says that the task of the new premier is the stiffest of his political career, and even some of his staunchest supporters, which include all the Tory press, abstain from prophesying success, while some indicate doubt as to whether he will triumph over the great obstacles confronting him.

The Times, which hails Lloyd George's nomination to the premiership as "the only practical and straightforward way to end the crisis," says: "The outcome cannot be foretold. This, however, can be said, that Lloyd George has a far better chance of forming a Government than Bonar Law, whether he will succeed will depend largely on himself and his often-tried policy of rallying men of talent and enthusiasm to his side."

The Chronicle, referring to the difficulties facing the new premier, says: "Only a man of hot-blooded courage would face them. He has no organized following in the House of Commons, and no party machine to help him, whilst the situation of affairs whether at home or abroad is not by any means cheerful. But the very boldness of the enterprise may win the sympathy of the British Democracy, in which case lack of support from the party machine will be immaterial."

Unionists With Him.
There is a consensus of opinion among political correspondents that the principal Unionist statesmen will be willing to help the new prime minister, but that he cannot expect any assistance from his old Liberal colleagues who, according to the Times, will be disappointed.

NORWEGIAN VESSEL
ESCAPED FROM SUB
WHEN HAWSER BROKE

German Had Ordered Captive
To Tow Him To
Madeira.

London, Dec. 7.—The Norwegian steamer Solvang has arrived in an English port with the story of having escaped from a German submarine, when the hawser with which she was towing the U-boat parted in the middle of the night, and she was left to drift.

The Solvang, according to the story, was stopped in the Strait of Gibraltar by a submarine, which had both German and Austrian officers on board, and was ordered to tow the U-boat to Madeira.

RUSSIANS HAVE
BETTER OF WAR
IN THE WOODS

Counter-Attacks Drive Enemy
From Positions He Had
Won.

Petrograd, via London, Dec. 7.—3:08 p.m.—Teutonic troops yesterday penetrated Russian positions on the Russian western front, in the region of a wood to the north of Shelyov, and in the region of Gualovitz, according to today's Russian official statement. In both instances the statement adds, the Germans were driven out by Russian counter-attacks. The text reads:

"Western front: In the region of the wood which is to the north of the village of Shelyov, the enemy, under cover of artillery fire, attacked our trenches and captured a small portion of our position. He was driven out by our counter-attacks."

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POSITION RESTORED.

"In the region of Garbuzov and Gualovitz the enemy's artillery opened a violent fire on our trenches and on our nearest supplies. His infantry then took the offensive. The attacking troops, two companies strong, forced their way into part of our demolished trenches in the region of Gualovitz. They were driven out by our neighboring detachments and our position again was restored."

"In the wooded Carpathians our operations were suspended owing to a very dense fog, which hindered artillery fire. 'Caucasian front: The situation is unchanged.'"
