STECKER DEFEATS SZBYSZKO IN A HARD BOUT

Brown Out of Toe Hold To Take Fall After One Hour and 32 Minutes of Wrestling.

BOSTON, Feb. 12.-Joe Stecher, the world's chambion heavyweight wrest ler, successfully defended his title here tonight by defeating Wladek Szbyszko whom he downed in 1 hour, 32 minute and 30 seconds. The fall was made by a full body scissors and wrist lock. Stecher, while reeling under Szby szko's attack, secured the hold that resulted in the fall. For five minutes before he had been held in a toe hold after he had gripped Szbyszko for an equal length of time with a head lock. Stecher used principally the head lock and scissors, while Szbyszko relied upon the toe hold.
