#### AN AMAZING CRIME

From Chicago comes the news of one of the most atrocious crimes in the blood-stained history of that city. Yet it offers little opportunity for moralizing. The moving pictures have not yet been blamed. The murderer, a young man of twenty-three, has a good reputation and was a faithful Sunday School pupil. Presuming him to be sane, his crime must be regarded as one of the most amazing in criminal history. Harvey W. Church is the name of the murderer, and the motive of his crime was to secure a \$5,000 automobile. He entered into negotiations with a Packard agent and it was agreed that the car was to be delivered to his home and that he would pay for it with a certified cheque. The car was driven up in charge of two sales agents. One of them was Bernard Daugherty. Church met him at the door and asked him inside. Then he presented a revolver with one hand and a pair of handcuffs with the other and forced Daugherty to put them on. Then he escorted him to the cellar, and slipping his revolver into his pocket, picked up a baseball bat and clubbed his victim to death. To make sure of the job he slashed him with a hatchet, and then dragged the body to one side.

He went upstairs to meet the other salesman, Carl Ausmus, who came to inquire over the delay. Ausmus, too, he threatened with his revolver and forced down into the cellar. Him, too, he battered to death with the baseball bat. Later, at night, Church wrapped up the body of Daugherty in heavy sacking and carried it out to the car which had remained in front of the door. He took it to a high bridge and dropped it over into the river. Then he returned and scraping a hole beneath the floor of his garage, he piled the body of Ausmus in, covered it up and went to bed and to sleep. The next day he took his mother for a ride in the stolen Packard, in pursuance of a former engagement, and was arrested before he could return home, if to return was indeed his object, as seems probable. He had failed to weight the body of Daugherty and it floated in the river, which gave the first notice that a murder had been committed. The body was speedily identified, and Church's home was searched, resulting in the finding of the body of Ausmus. Church later made a confession in which he gave every horrifying detail of his atrocious crimes, but seemed unable to realize that he had done more than secure an automobile by the simplest means at hand. In this case it seems impossible to lay the blame on uneducated foreigners, to dissipation, the corruption of moving pictures, or to any of the causes that are so frequently found at the bottom of crimes in the United States. So amazing was his story that the hardened Chicago police are reluctant to believe that he told the precise truth and are digging deeper in the expectation of finding some accomplices or a more adequate reason for the double murder.
