NEW YORK BOARD PROBES CHARGES OF MALNUTRITION CRIPPLED BY

Appalling Conditions Related to Housing Commission as Horrible and Inhuman Scenes Are Described And Depicted.

New York .- Stories of whole families suffering from malnutrition because they could not pay the rent and buy food too, of mothers starving that their babies might eat; of tenement districts where the average infant was six pounds under weight of "safety-last" fire escapes and gouging landlords-all because of the shortage of homes and exorbitant rents-were related before the Housing Commission recently. Judges and welfare workers, professors, wage earners and mothers with babes-inarms, appealed to the commission to recommend renewal of the emergency rent laws so that when they expire next February thousands of families may not be thrown upon the mercy of landlords.

The climax in a steady recital of conditions variously described as horrible, inhuman, indecent and deplorable, came when the commission asked Justice Aaron I. Levy, President of the Board of Municipal Court Justices, if he would suggest any amendment of the emergency rent laws. "Yes," answered the Justice. "I would wipe out the rent laws and abolish the landlords' right to summary proceedings and ejection of ten-

ants. He still would have the commen law to fall back upon." Contrary to previous testimon




