

THE GLASGOW MARKET.

Messrs. Edmiston & Mitchell's monthly timber circular of November 10th says: Business during November has, on the whole, been quiet, and though values have been fairly well maintained there has been no great activity in the matter of buying. The import was again very moderate, and in nearly all cases was disposed of from the ship's side...

Of American hardwoods, the chief enquiry has been for plain oak lumber; popular lumber and quartered oak being slow of sale, and prices for both are easier. A similar report may be given of oak planks, the import of which has exceeded the demand.

The Scotch shipbuilding returns for the month show that 27 vessels of 28,270 tons were launched, against 21 vessels aggregating 20,210 for the corresponding month last year. A gratifying feature has been the amount of new work placed recently,

amounting as it does to 66,000 tons, making a total of 46,000 tons of new contracts placed this year, which insures activity for some time to come in this important industry. Housebuilding, on the other hand, has been slackening off for some time past, and prospects of renewed activity in the near future are by no means reassuring, tenement building having been overdone in the district.

WHITE PINE. The import consists of about 200 loads waney pine, per the liners, and was disposed of "ex-quay." One or two fair lines of waney deckwood were disposed of, but enquiries are few. Prices continue firm. Stock is ample.

OAK.—The demand continues limited, there having been only a few small sales during the month. Stocks are still heavy.

ELM.—Enquiries are fairly numerous for large-sized rock elm, and stock of this class is now low. Prices are high. Soft wood is moving off more freely, though stock is still large.

BIRCH (Quebec).—The report for November has been about 140 logs, all of which were disposed of from the quay at prices ranging from 18. 4/6d. for 13 to 14-inch up to 18. 10/6d. for 16-inch. There is more enquiry of late, and there is no Quebec birch in first hands for sale.

N. B. BIRCH.—There was one import of about 30 logs and 50 loads planks from St. John, which were disposed of "ex-quay," but prices did not transpire. Values are round 18. 5d. for 15 inch average. For planks there is more en-

quiry, and the stock is now considerably reduced.

ASH.—A few retail sales are reported of small logs at unsatisfactory prices, but in most cases it is old timber of indifferent quality, for which it may be said, there is very little outlet nowadays. The stock, though small, is ample for the market's requirements.

DEALS, &c.—The import during the month has been exceedingly moderate, and most of the goods arriving have been disposed of "ex-quay." First pine deals of all sizes, and second pine deals, 7/10-inch x 3-inch, are scarce. Lower qualities are plentiful and difficult to move. Prices are firm as under:—Broad First Pine Deals—£32 to £34; 11-inch, £29 to £31; Ends and Non-Dimensions, £22 to £24. Second Pine Deals—11-inch and up, £17 to £19; Ends and Non-Dimensions, £13 to £14 10s. Third Pine Deals—11-inch and up, £11 to £14; Ends and Non-Dimensions, £9 10s to £10 10s. Red Pine Deals—9 and 11 inch, £10 to £11; Narrows, £7 to £8 10s. First Pine Sidings and Strips—9 and 10 inch, £23 to £24; 11 to 12 inch £25 to £26; 13 to 14 inch, £27 to £28. Spruce Deals—9 inch and up, £8 to £8 10s.; 7 and 8 inch, £6 15s. to £7 10s. Lower Port Spruce—9-inch and up, £7 10s. to £8; 7 and 8 inch, £6 5s. to £7.

During November over 17,000,000 feet of lumber was shipped from the port of Ashland, Wis.
