UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

One of the most interesting items brought by the last mail is the movement in the University of Oxford to extend its efforts and increase its accommodation. A well-attended meeting was held in the Hall of Oriel College, on the 16th Novr., which affirmed without a dissentient voice that the University ought to be extended, and resolved that each College and Hall should be invited to send a representative to a Committee, in which a scheme for this purpose might be prepared. "It appears to be a growing opinion in Oxford that a machinery so costly and elaborate ought to be made applicable to a larger purpose than the education of twelve or fifteen hundred men." One of the proximate causes of the meeting seems to have been "the scanty supply of educated young men for the work of the Ministry. All the speakers laid stress on this fact, though from different points of view; and the grand object seems to be to make Oxford more of a nursing mother to the Church than she had hitherto been." It also appears that the income of the University and College within a few years will be increased by at least \$500,000. We shall watch the progress of the movement with much interest. It was stated that the number of students in attendance was so large that almost every available room was occupied.
