We were all pleased to have with us Inspector Finn, who addressed the teachers on "Inspection and Supervision," pointing out the details an inspector looked for when visiting a

school.

Perhaps the most looked-forward-to paper on the programme was Miss F. L. Ormand's, of Winnipeg, on the "Teaching of English to the Non-English." Our expectations were realized when we had heard Miss Ormand's excellent paper, and it was very helpful and instructive, because so many have this problem to face.

The last paper on the programme was given by Mr. C. Laine on "Club and School Fairs." Mr. Laine told of his own experience in Club fair work and how we might make our fairs more suc-

cessful.

The Resolution Committee submitted their report and it was unanimously ac-

cepted.

The closing item of the Convention was the election of officers for the coming year. The following officers were elected: First Vice-President, Mr. J. deB.
