### Tariff Impacts of Free Trade

U.S. tariffs on stranded wire, rope and cables ranged from 1% to 5.8%. Under the Free Trade Agreement, these tariffs will be reduced in ten equal stages so that duty free status is achieved by January 1, 1998.

### Tariff Impacts of Free Trade

U.S. tariffs on mathematical instruments ranged from 4.9% to 5.8%. Under the Free Trade Agreement, these duties will be removed on January 1, 1998, in ten equal stages.
