

1.3. Forms of Activities

In the exercise of its mandate, the Center:

- sponsors or supports seminars, workshops, exhibitions, training courses, exchanges, fellowships, etc;
- sponsors or supports studies related to environmental issues of high priority;
- supports professionals on rotational assignment to work on major Center programs or projects;
- maintains and publicizes a collection of environmental information for use of the public; and
- engages in such other forms of activities as will further its goals.

1.4. Cooperation with Governments and Organizations

The Center may develop formal or informal ties to other organizations with related interests. Participation by government agencies and non-governmental groups, international organizations, citizens groups, academia and industry representatives is encouraged.

2. Board of Trustees

2.1. General Powers

The Board possesses all the power of managers of not-for-profit organizations under Hungarian law, including the authority to acquire and dispose of property, make contracts and otherwise manage the affairs of the Center. It may appoint technical and financial advisory committees as needed.

2.2. Number, Qualification, Election and Tenure

The Center is governed by a Board of Trustees consisting of no less than ten (10) and no more than fifteen (15) members who shall serve for three-year terms. During the first term of the Board, in order to
