their foreheads, and will be received by the captain of salvation-97-19.

94.—This affecting emblem, as masonically contemplated, has a twofold reference, peculiarly calculated to awaken *reverence* on the one hand and *devotion* on the other-*Compiler*.

95.—These implements have been already explained but every Companion has a satisfactory reason why they are here placed. Do they not remind us of three ancient worthies who have been sleeping for ages in the dust, and on whose graves the tears of thousands successfully fall, nourishing the balmy Cassia that flourishes there ?—Compiler.

96.—These emblems like the bow of promise on the summer cloud, are impressive memorials of the overruling providence and *miraculous* goodness of the great divinity.

Scripture.

96.—This is the thing which the Lord commandeth, Fill an ome of it to be kept for your generations; that they may see the bread wherewith I have fed you in the wilderness, when I brought you forth from the land of Egypt. And Moses said unto Aaron, Take a pot, and put an omer full of manna therein, and lay it up before the Lord-Ex. xvi, 32.
