HALIFAX INFANTS' HOME—The object of this Home is to receive snd care for destitute infants. Its affairs are managed by a Committee of ladies. The annual expenditure amounts to about \$3000. The number of infants in the Home at any one time is about forty-five. When the children are about two years old they are given out to be adopted by families in the country.
