

KINGSEY.

While several works have been accomplished in this mission, viz.: fencing church-yard of Holy Trinity, and providing a stone well at the parsonage, the amount collected falls short of last year by \$111.66.

LENNOXVILLE AND MILBY.

The Rector reports a large falling off in subscribers by removal, and a reduction by others, which he readily accounts for—in consequence there is a large deficiency in the sum collected this year compared with last year's amount.

MAGOG AND GEORGEVILLE.

Incumbent reports all church property out of debt. Increase in amount raised over last year, \$347.18.

MELBOURNE AND RICHMOND.

SHERBROOKE.

The Rector reports the loss of valuable communion plate and linen, which were stolen from the church; also a subscription to replace them, which already reaches \$300.

Twenty-one communicants have been added during the year, making the number 230.

While the actual receipts for all church purposes fall short of last year by \$291.37, the amount for extra parochial purposes exceeds that of last year by \$17.

The Sunday school is composed of 121 scholars, 12 teachers and a superintendent, who have been zealous and diligent in this important part of our church work.

STANSTEAD.

The church school in this mission is progressing favorably, the work done being creditable to teacher and scholars alike. There is a marked attachment on the part of the children to the church. Amount of subscriptions exceeds that of last year by \$132.88.
