" have, hold and enjoy the faid stile, title,

" Majesty and honors of King of Ireland,

" with all manner of preeminence, prero-

" gatives, dignities, and all other the pre-

" mifes unto the King's highness, his heirs

" and fucceffors for ever, as united and

" knit to the Imperial Crown of the realm

" of England," &c.

Many other Acts I might adduce, all proving the ancient annexation, fubordination and dependency of the Land, Lordship, and Crown of Ireland on the Imperial Crown of England, before any Statute was enacted for that purpose, but I hasten to more modern times, in which this great constitutional point has been proved in actual practice, and confirmed by various Statutes of this Kingdom.

When King James II. in 1688, had abdicated his Crown of England, and, on the 7th of February, 1688-9, the Lords united with the Commons of the Convention Parliament in a vote that the throne
